The Lord agreed to let Satin have his way, only with his possessions at first. After the Lord allowed devil took in charge of Job, all his livestock was either burned up from fire from the sky, or carried off by raiders. All his servants were either burned from the fire in the sky, or were put to death by raiders. There also came a mighty wind that swept in from the desert and struck the four corners of Job's house. The house collapsed and killed all seven of Job's children, at once. After being completely wiped out in an instant, instead of cursing out the Lord which most people would have done, Job did just the opposite. In Job 1:20-21 At this, Job got up and tore his robe and shaved his head. Then he fell to the ground in worship and said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised". There is a lot more to this story, that was only test one, and Job passed with flying colors. If you are suffering at this time, or you would like to know more about real trials, I recommend that you read the entire book of Job. If you take a good look around, there is so much suffering going on throughout the world today. Every time you turn on the TV, read the paper, turn on the radio, there is always something somewhere to do with tragedy and suffering. As we travel to and from in this world, there is always something there to remind us of suffering.
