

SIN'S FORGIVENESS

Hello again my brothers and sisters, welcome to the Spiritual Connection's monthly Journal for February 2017. This month's Inspired message has to do with freedom from sin. What is freedom from sin mean? Freedom from sin means, that through the death of Christ Jesus on the cross, sin's debt has been paid in full. Jesus Christ is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world! The Bible tells us in 1 Peter 2:24 that; He Himself bore our sins in His Body on the tree, so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness; by His wounds you have been healed. Also in 1 John 3:5 it is written; But you know that He appeared so that He might take away our sins. And in Him there is no sin. Christ died for our sins in our place, so we would not have to suffer the punishment we really deserve as sinners. In this fallen world, we may suffer for many reasons. Some suffering is a direct result of our own sin; some happens because of our foolishness; some is a result of living in a fallen world. There is also suffering that comes as a result of doing good; for example, Christ never sinned, and yet He suffered so that we could be free from sin. Jesus suffering was a part of God's plan. (Matthew 16:21-23; Luke 24:25-27, 44-47) and was intended to save us. (Matthew 20:28; 26:28) All who follow Jesus must be prepared to suffer. (Mark 8:34,35). Our goal is to face suffering as He did—with patience, calmness, and confidence that God is in control of our future, not us. All suffering has meaning in God's Kingdom. Pain and problems are opportunities to demonstrate our trust in God. Bearing our circumstances bravely----even thanking Him for them, is one of the highest forms of praise.

Do not try to run from pain or try and hide from your problems. Instead, accept adversity in My Name, offering it up for My purpose; thus, your suffering, gains meaning and draws us closer to God. (James 1:2-4). In order for God to forgive our sins, we must confess our past and present sins, with a contrite heart. After we have confessed our sins sincerely, we should feel a sense of relief from carrying the heavy burden of sin. In order to be free from sin, we must be spiritually transformed from within. Once we have been transformed spiritually, is when the Holy Spirit comes to live inside of us. This process is called the "Indwelling of the Holy Spirit". In 1 John 1:9 it is written; If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

The Lord longs for us to confess our sins to Him, so He, can sanctify us from within. The Lord wants us to not be afraid to confess our sins honestly--in His Divine Presence. Do not try to run away from God, or try to shift the blame to some one else, that's not going to work! Try and remember, God is all Sovereign possessing supreme and ultimate power; God, is Omnipotent, He has unlimited power, able to do anything; also, God is Omnipresent; He is present everywhere at the same time. As the Scripture tells us above, once God has forgiven us from our sins, He will then cleanse us from within, of all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:7 tells us; If we walk in the Light, as He is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son purifies us from all sin.

Freedom from sin also means that, once we have been sanctified by the blood of Christ, we should be dead to sin and alive in Jesus. Because God has forgiven our sins, does not give us the right to go on sinning. It is written in Romans 6:1-2; What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? If God loves to forgive, why not give Him more to forgive? If forgiveness is guaranteed, do we have the freedom to sin as much as we want? By no means! Such an attitude----deciding ahead of time to take advantage of God---shows that a person does not understand the seriousness of sin yet! God's forgiveness does not make sin less serious, Christ death for our sins shows us the dreadful seriousness of sin. Jesus paid with His life so we could be forgiven. The availability of God's mercy must not become an excuse for careless living and moral laxness. If we truly love God, and we happened to sin, we should be anxious to repent; and if we are anxious to repent, we should ask the Holy Spirit for more discernmentAmen!!

So my brothers and sisters, try and always remember that God's unwarranted forgiveness for our sins, is a blessing of unfathomable proportions. Through God's Love, Grace, and Mercy, we all have an equal opportunity to be forgiven from all our sins from the past, present, and future. We all have a once in a lifetime chance to start a new direction and a new life in Christ Jesus. This is the best gift that a man or woman could ever receive in a lifetime! Just think, the Creator of the Universe so loved the world that He sent His one and only Son down to earth to die for our sins! Through His death on the cross and His resurrection from the grave, Christ is able to lift us up from darkness into His Light. Reason being, His greatness is profound. He has done mighty acts across many generations. He is full of glorious splendor and majesty. He does wonderful and awesome works. He is righteous. He is gracious, compassionate, patient, and loving. He rules over an everlasting kingdom. He is righteous and loving in all His dealings. He remains near to those who call on Him. He hears our cries and saves us. In closing, please try to remember, if we sincerely confess our sins to God, He is faithful and just and will forgive all our sins. Also, He will purify us from within, of all unrighteousness.
